PLEASE CHECK YOUR PARCEL

Please make sure you **PROMPTLY OPEN** and **CHECK THE CONTENTS** of your parcel as soon as you receive it. Our volunteers make every effort to get your order right, but occasionally mistakes are made. If you receive the wrong appliances, we need to know as soon as possible and **definitely within the same month you received the parcel**, otherwise we are unable to make any exchange.

HELP US TO HELP YOU!

Many of our ostomates are unaware that they are able to order their appliances at **any time** during the month of issue, so consequently elect to contact our office on the first Monday of the month in the misunderstanding that this is what is required. This invariably causes an overload on our phone system and we simply don't have enough staff to answer all the phone calls, take messages, serve at the counter, etc. If you are not desperate for your supplies at the beginning of the month we encourage you to wait until nearer the middle of the month before placing your order. This will help alleviate the congestion and means you are less likely to encounter communication issues when trying to contact the office. Thank you for your cooperation.

You **MUST** be a financial member before any appliances can be issued to you. If you are unable to pay your annual membership fee which is due on 1 July each year, please contact the Secretary for a Time Payment request.

POSTAL ORDERS

- ALL ORDERS should be addressed to P.O. Box 280, Moonah, 7009.
- Please state your order clearly, quoting the brand name, code no., size and number of appliances you require. Remember to include your name and address.
- Please DON'T ask for "my usual order." Although we have a record of your usual appliances, we don't always know what your usual accessory items are. The best way to ensure you get what you want is to quote the brand and code no.
- Make sure to **allow at least two weeks for return delivery**, especially when ordering a two-month supply (including holiday orders).
- POSTAGE, PACKAGE AND HANDLING \$12.50 per parcel
- You can pay bulk postage up to 12 months in advance if you wish.
- Please include this payment with your order. Remember to cross all cheques and money orders and make them payable to Ostomy Tasmania. Write your name and address on the back of money orders.
- We have the facility to run a postage account for you if you would like to pay a bulk amount of postage money, thus saving costs of multiple cheques, money orders etc. In this case, you can submit your order by phone, fax, email or online ordering.
- You can make an internet transfer to our bank account (BSB 807 009, Account No. 5109 4661, Name of account: Ostomy Tasmania Inc.)
 Make sure you include your full name as a reference.
- You can phone the office and pay by credit card (\$2 transaction fee applies).

• OPENING HOURS:

Mondays (excluding Public Holidays) 9.00 a.m. - 12 noon and 1.00 pm - 3.00 pm Tuesdays 9.00 am - 1.00 pm.

• WHERE:

St Johns Park, New Town: the former Amenities Building, which is the second building on your left as you drive in to the St Johns Park complex from Creek Road. Look for the "Ostomy Tasmania" signs on the building. A few parking spaces are available outside the building (look for the signs).

• Bring a box end (with code number) along so we can see what you require.

Credit card and EFTPOS facilities are available at the Distribution Centre. A transaction fee of \$2.00 applies to card payments to help offset our costs.

CERTIFICATES

APPLICATION FOR ADDITIONAL STOMA SUPPLIES certificates (from your Stomal Therapy Nurse or your Doctor) are required for all issues in excess of the maximum monthly allowances.

- Certificates **must** be on Australian Government form PB050, "Application for Additional Stoma Supplies" and be signed by you **and** the STN or Doctor.
- certificates **must** be for a valid medical reason
- they **must** state the number of appliances required
- you will need to contact your STN or GP to renew your certificate every 6 months if the extra product is still required; our office staff can't do it for you.

PLEASE NOTIFY THE OFFICE

- If you have changed your address
- If you are the relation of a member who has died
- If you've had a reversal of your ostomy
- Don't expect that your Stomal Therapy Nurse will let us know.

MEMBERSHIP FEES DUE 1 JULY

All Australian ostomates are required to pay a uniform fee to be eligible for free appliances from the Stoma Reminder: Please make sure money orders and cheques are payable to "Ostomy Tasmania Inc."

Appliance Scheme. This National Access Fee is mandatory and it is not possible for us to waive it, nor to supply appliances to unfinancial members. Members who cannot pay the full fee at once can apply to pay by instalments by completing a Time Payment Request available from the office. For the 2016/2017 period, our combined fee is **\$60 per year for ordinary members** and **\$50 per year for concession card holders.**

Your fee **MUST** be paid the first time you order appliances after 1 July, or an agreement to pay the fee by instalments must be entered into. Concessional categories include full and part Centrelink pension and Healthcare card holders.

ARE YOU WILLING TO GET INVOLVED?

Are you willing to become a committee member of Ostomy Tasmania Inc.? It is vital to have an informed, interested and capable committee to manage the Association's affairs. Our Constitution allows for ostomates and non-ostomates to be committee members. WHY WON'T MY BAGS STICK?

This is very unpleasant and frustrating. There are a few reasons why this may occur, namely:

Sore skin due to leakage under the appliance.

Other skin conditions such as allergy or other dermatological problem.

- <u>Products used</u> can affect adhesion. Please use only products designed for use under your appliance or those suggested by your STN or doctor. If you have prescribed creams/lotions, apply sparingly and let dry if possible. A light sprinkling of stomahesive or adapt powder can help the appliance stick.
- <u>Technique</u> sometimes habits can creep in which affect adherence. Avoid being rushed: clean and dry the skin well; warm the appliance against your body for a minute or two. If you use both an adhesive remover and barrier film ensure that they are used in the right order, as nothing will stick to adhesive remover.
- <u>Sweat</u> a light sprinkling of stomahesive or adapt powder can help absorb excessive sweat. Using an unscented roll-on antiperspirant (not deodorant) can assist but test on another part of the body first for any skin reactions.
- <u>Hair</u> appliances are designed to stick to hair however if you have excessive hair you may find it beneficial to shave. Avoid doing so too frequently as this can cause hair follicles to become inflamed and result in irritation.
- <u>Changes in shape</u> of your belly, through weight loss/gain, surgery or a hernia, can mean that your appliance is no longer appropriate. Please see your STN if you suspect this is the case.

It is recommended that you have your stoma checked every couple of years.

NEW PRODUCT: 4ME UNDERWEAR

Recently we received at our office some brochures relating to a new line of underwear available to ostomates called "4ME Underwear". Director & ostomate Michelle Somerville stated... "After having a colostomy I was anxious to find something other than medical grade underwear – something comfortable that felt just like the underwear I had worn before having a stoma. I know that I would have gratefully received any suggestions or alternatives from my association at the time. My primary goal in developing this underwear range was to offer ostomates a choice in underwear – not everyone with a stoma needs the support of medical grade underwear and it's great to be presented with some affordable options." WHAT TO DO WITH UNWANTED ITEMS?

Many people will attempt to return to our office (or parcel post at personal expense) items which have been issued but for whatever reason are no longer required. Sadly this can often be a family member or partner who has lost a loved one who was an ostomate and had a large backlog of supplies in the cupboard. If these items (opened or unopened) are outside of their month of issue unfortunately we cannot take them back (or replace them with another). This is because we have already been reimbursed by Medicare for the item/s, and are not permitted to accept returns. However there is something you can do! Your Stomal Therapy Nurse at your local hospital *can* accept these items, and will often distribute them to other ostomates as and when needed. However, you should contact your local STN first to make sure the products are suitable for others and that the STN has room to store them. The appliances may also be able to be sent overseas to ostomates in need via a special fund.
