PLEASE CHECK YOUR PARCEL

Please make sure you **PROMPTLY OPEN** and **CHECK THE CONTENTS** of your parcel as soon as you receive it. Our volunteers make every effort to get your order right, but occasionally mistakes are made. If you receive the wrong appliances, we need to know as soon as possible and **definitely within the same month you received the parcel**, otherwise we are unable to make any exchange.

MEETING TIMES?

It's been suggested that we may attract more members to our management committee meetings if we hold them at night instead of on a Saturday afternoon as at present. Please email Sue at <u>admin@ostomytas.com.au</u> if this would be of interest to you.

You **MUST** be a financial member before any appliances can be issued to you. If you are unable to pay your annual Stoma Appliance Scheme Access Fee which is due on 1 July each year, please contact the Secretary for a Time Payment request.

POSTAL ORDERS

- ALL ORDERS should be addressed to P.O. Box 280, Moonah, 7009.
- Please state your order clearly, **quoting the brand name, code no., size and number** of appliances you require. Remember to include your name and address.
- Please DON'T ask for "my usual order." Although we have a record of your usual appliances, we don't always know what your usual accessory items are. The best way to ensure you get what you want is to quote the brand and code no.
- Make sure to **allow at least two weeks for return delivery**, especially when ordering a two-month supply (including holiday orders).
- POSTAGE, PACKAGE AND HANDLING \$12.50 per parcel
- Please include this payment with your order. Remember to cross all cheques and money orders and make them payable to Ostomy Tasmania. Write your name and address on the back of money orders.
- We have the facility to run a postage account for you if you would like to pay a bulk amount of postage money (up to 12 months), thus saving costs of multiple cheques, money orders etc. In this case, you can submit your order by phone, fax, email or online ordering.
- You can make an internet transfer to our bank account (BSB 807 009, Account No. 5109 4661, Name of account: Ostomy Tasmania Inc.)
 Make sure you include members full name as a reference.
- You can phone the office and pay by credit card.

• WHERE:

CERTIFICATES

APPLICATION FOR ADDITIONAL STOMA SUPPLIES certificates (from your Stomal Therapy Nurse or your Doctor) are required for all issues in excess of the maximum monthly allowances.

- Certificates **must** be on Australian Government form PB050, "Application for Additional Stoma Supplies" and be signed by you **and** the STN or Doctor.
- certificates **must** be for a valid medical reason
- they **must** state the number of appliances required
- **you** will need to contact your STN or GP to renew your certificate every 6 months if the extra product is still required; our office staff can't do it for you.

PLEASE NOTIFY THE OFFICE

- if you have changed your address;
- if you are the relation of a member who has died;
- if you've had a reversal of your ostomy.
- Don't expect that your Stomal Therapy Nurse will let us know.

SAS ACCESS FEES ARE 1ST JULY 2019

All Australian ostomates are required to pay a uniform fee to be eligible for free appliances from the Stoma Appliance Scheme. The Stoma Appliance Scheme Access Fee is mandatory and it is not possible for us to waive it, nor to supply appliances to unfinancial members. Members who cannot pay the full fee at once can apply to pay by instalments by completing a Time Payment Request form available from the office. For the 2019/2020 period, the fee is

Reminder: Please make sure money orders and cheques are made payable to "Ostomy Tasmania Inc." Direct Credit payments must include member's name as reference.

\$60 per year for ordinary members and \$50 per year for concession card holders.

Your fee **MUST** be paid the first time you order appliances after 1 July 2019, or an agreement to pay the fee by instalments must be entered into. Concessional categories include full and part Centrelink pension and Healthcare card holders.

OSTOMY CHRISTMAS CELEBRATIONS



VOLUNTEER PROFILE – ROBERT MCMANUS

Robert McManus is one of our dedicated volunteers who attends the office every Monday. Robert's role is to weigh and label the parcels to be posted via the eParcel system (Australia Post). It's fair to say Robert is not so enamored with computer operations, however when we made the change to eParcel he applied himself diligently to understanding the software operation required to ensure a smooth dispatch, thus mastering the process. Although sadly now a widower, Robert enjoys interactions with his 4 children and 17 grandchildren. Robert is a recipient of the Order of Australia Medal (2017) and brings a wealth of experience from a lifetime of work and volunteering. Robert supplied the following details about his work and volunteer history:

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Work life: Certified Practicing Accountant, worked in the Tasmanian Government 37 years (1957 -1984) principally as head of the Corporate Affairs Office for 19 years as Commissioner for Corporate Affairs and 7 years as State Commissioner of Taxes at the State Revenue Office.

Community Service: Ostomy Tasmania volunteer since 2005 (ostomate for 6 months in 2004); Abbeyfield House since 2007 providing accommodation for ten elderly persons, president of committee of Management; Volunteer Fireman Seven Mile Beach Fire Brigade since 2008 (done over 100 call outs); Melody Lane Singers since 2007, leading a group which sings in nursing homes every few weeks; St Vincent De Paul Society since 1970, home visitation to provide assistance to persons in need, served on several state and national committees of the Society, chairman of committee of management of Bethlehem House 1992 – 1999, the Society's facility for homeless men; Samaritan Trust, trustee since 2002 of the Archbishop of Hobart charitable trust.

Former Service: St John Ambulance Tasmania, member of the committee of management 2002 – 2015 mostly as State Treasurer; Lifeline counsellor 2007-2010; Bible Society 2000 – 2014, member of state and national committees of management; Catholic Care 2001- 2009, member of committee of management, chairman 2006 – 2009; L'Arche Beni Abbes treasurer 2009 – 2013.
