STOMA AWARENESS WEEK

The following was submitted to the local media during National Stoma Awareness Week (June 19-25) by our president, Ross De Little, and featuring local ostomate Jess (pictured):

'Imagine! What can you be?' Stoma is derived from the Greek word meaning 'body opening'. In our world a stoma is a surgically made opening in the abdomen that allows body waste to be removed through the end of the bowel into a collection bag. There are some 55,000 people in Australia including 1500 in Tasmania living with a stoma. There are basically 3 types of stoma; colostomy (bowel), ileostomy (small intestine) and urostomy, (bladder). Ostomy Tasmania Inc. is a registered charity that administers the distribution of all medical products that those with a stoma require.continued page 6

INFORMATION FOR MEMBERS

You **MUST** be a financial member before any appliances can be issued to you.

If you are unable to pay your annual Stoma Appliance Scheme Access Fee which is due on 1 July each year, please contact the Secretary for a Time Payment request.

POSTAL ORDERS

ALL ORDERS should be addressed to P.O. Box 280, Moonah, 7009.

- Please state your order clearly, quoting the brand name, code no., size and number of appliances you require. Remember to include your name and address.
- Please DON'T ask for "my usual order." Although we have a record of your usual appliances, we don't always know what your usual accessory items are. The best way to ensure you get what you want is to quote the brand and code no.
- Make sure to **allow at least** *THREE* **weeks for return delivery**, especially when ordering a two-month supply (including holiday orders).
- POSTAGE, PACKAGE AND HANDLING \$15.00 per parcel (extra for parcels over 6kg)
- Please include this payment with your order. Remember to cross all cheques and money orders and make them payable to Ostomy Tasmania. Write your name and address on the back of money orders.
- We have the facility to run a postage account for you if you would like to pay a bulk amount of postage money (up to 12 months), thus saving costs of multiple cheques, money orders etc. In this case, you can submit your order by fax, email or online ordering. NB: **Phone order availability limited.**

- CURRENT OPENING HOURS: Mondays (excluding Public Holidays) 9.00 a.m. 12 noon and 1.00 pm 3.00 pm. Tuesdays to Fridays 9.00 am 1.00 pm.
- WHERE: St Johns Park, New Town: Amenities Building, which is the second building on your left as you turn in to the St Johns Park complex (Woodhouse Road) from Creek Road. CERTIFICATES

APPLICATION FOR ADDITIONAL STOMA SUPPLIES certificates (from your Stomal Therapy Nurse or your Doctor) are required for all issues in excess of the maximum monthly allowances.

- Certificates **must** be on Australian Government form PB050, "Application for Additional Stoma Supplies" and be signed by you **and** the STN or Doctor.
- certificates **must** be for a valid medical reason
- they must state the total number of appliances required
- you will need to contact your STN or GP to renew your certificate every 6 months if the extra product is still required; our office staff can't do it for you.

PLEASE NOTIFY THE OFFICE

- if you have changed your address;
- if you are the relation of a member who has died;
- if you've had a reversal of your ostomy.
- Don't expect that your Stomal Therapy Nurse will let us know.

PLEASE CHECK YOUR PARCEL

Please make sure you **PROMPTLY OPEN** and **CHECK THE CONTENTS** of your parcel as soon as you receive it. We make every effort to get your order right, but occasionally mistakes are made. If you receive the wrong appliances, we need to know as soon as possible and **definitely within the same month you received the parcel**, otherwise we are unable to make any exchange.

ANNUAL FEES WERE DUE 1ST JULY 2023

All Australian ostomates are required to pay the Stoma Appliance Scheme Access Fee to be eligible for free appliances from the Scheme. This fee is mandatory, and it is not possible for us to waive it, nor to supply appliances to unfinancial members. Members who cannot pay the full fee at once can apply to pay by instalments by completing a Time Payment Request form available from the office. For the 2023/2024 period, the fee will remain at:

Reminder: Please make sure money orders and cheques are made payable to "Ostomy Tasmania Inc." Direct Credit payments must include member's name as reference.

- \$70 per year for full members
- \$60 per year for concession card holders.

Your fee **MUST** be paid the first time you order appliances after 1 July 2023, or an agreement to pay the fee by instalments must be entered into. Concessional categories include full and part Centrelink pension and Healthcare card holders.

This is Jess's story:

Hi, my name is Jess and I have an ileostomy. My surgery was on 13/07/2021 and I call my stoma "Romi the Stomi". In the beginning I was diagnosed with Ulcerative Colitis which led to fistulating Crohn's disease. I had had some 100 procedures on perianal fistulas with a never ending array of drains and setons inserted into my bottom, the pain and discomfort was horrific, both physically and mentally. I was booked in for laparoscopy pan prolectomy surgery and although I had endured a lot, I was more concerned at the time about having a bag on my tummy for life! But I really needed the operation and therefore had to accept the challenge as I knew it would change my life in a positive way. Waking from surgery, I looked down to see my new body part. It was confronting, even though I was aware of what I was about to see! After several re-admissions I began gaining strength, both mentally and physically and by mid September I was back in the gym! My passion for life was stronger than ever, I was pain free and my mind was the clearest it had been in a very long time. I commenced Pilates as I really wanted to restore my core to its former strength. I had made some huge life changes! Body confidence plays a big role in the acceptance of an ostomy. Education is paramount and of course removing the stigma of talking about wee and poo as they form part of our bodily functions. Ostomy Tas perform an amazing role, ordering online is easy and the staff and volunteers are both compassionate and caring. Wow! What a legend this Romi girl is, she has literally changed and saved my life. There are just so many positives and I really feel a huge weight has been lifted from my body and mind.

CHRISTMAS CLOSURE DATES

Christmas Closure 2023/24: Last day **Tuesday 19th December** 2023; Reopen **Tuesday 2nd January** 2024. Orders must be in by Monday 4th December if delivery is required prior to Xmas. \$50 opening fee applies over the closure period if we need to open up especially for you.

WHEN TO PLACE YOUR MONTHLY ORDER

Some members may not be aware they can place an order at any time during the current month, however we have had instances where people leave it until the very last day, or weekend, to place an order. This can be problematic because orders will likely not get processed until we are back in the office (eg. at the beginning of the next month), meaning you may miss out on a month's supply. We therefore request you avoid placing your orders on weekends, public holidays, or out of office hours, if the end of the month is imminent. Thank you for your assistance.

ST JOHN'S PARK MASTERPLAN

The State Government has announced a 20 year masterplan to transform St John's Park into a contemporary Health and Well-being precinct. It will affect Ostomy Tasmania's present site, the Amenities Building. You may have seen the release on local media.

Our site is involved in stage 4 of the plan. We have sought further information regarding our future in the Park. Public consultation was scheduled to begin in June 2023 but has yet to commence. Once we receive further information we will advise members.

OCTOBER 1ST ALLOCATION CHANGES TO S.A.S.

From 1st October 2023 Support Garment Briefs and Pants are being removed from the Stoma Appliance Scheme (SAS) however Support Belts will remain and will increase from 3 to 4 per calendar year. If you have not yet received your full allowance of support pants, now is the time to order them (we need to receive orders before 18th September to have time to get them in and issue to you before 30 Sept. The maximum monthly issue for ALL Cleanser Wipes is being reduced to 60 units per month. In addition, to receive any brand of Cleanser Wipes from 1 October 2023 on (e.g. Coloplast 12080 or 4715, Dansac 71000-0010 or 710000-000), you will require an authorization certificate from your STN or GP and we will be unable to issue them without this. Unfortunately, this is a decision made by the Commonwealth Department of Health and Aged Care and is therefore outside of our control. If you need to still receive Cleanser Wipes, you should contact your STN as soon as possible (don't leave it until the last minute!)

CHANGES TO SUPPLIER DELIVERIES

Over recent months we have been forced to renegotiate delivery arrangements with some of our suppliers. Due to the high costs of air freight since Covid first impacted, some of our suppliers have made the shift to road freight delivery from Melbourne warehouses to Tasmania to save money. Whilst we always work hard to minimise wait times for our member's orders, this naturally impacts on our ability to get your supplies out to you in a timely fashion. Consequently, we request our membership make some allowance for a later delivery time than you may be used to (ie. up to 1 week delay), - hence we encourage you to submit your order with plenty of time to spare (ie. 2-3 weeks ahead). We apologies for any inconvenience this may cause, however as you will appreciate, the situation is one which is out of our control. NB: most weekly ordering is done before 10am Monday mornings.
